
Recreation and Colorado's Water Plan

• Colorado's Water Plan sets a measurable objective to cover 80% of the locally prioritized lists of rivers with stream management plans, and 80% of critical watersheds with watershed protection plans by 2030.

Water Supply Reserve Fund

- <u>Sambrito Wetlands</u> WSRF proposal, approved in March, will contribute towards key water infrastructure improvement activities necessary to restore 100 acres of the Sambrito wetlands.
- <u>Stream Management Plan, Upper San Juan River Basin</u> -WSRF will assist Mountain Studies Institute in the development of a Stream Management Plan for the Upper San Juan River Basin
