Damage Summary (2015)

- Flood area over 1900 square miles (18 counties)
- \$2 \$3 billion estimated damages
- 3,000 people rescued, 11,000 evacuated
- 1,500 homes destroyed, 19,000 damaged
- 200 commercial buildings destroyed, 800 damaged
- 30 bridges destroyed, 20 damaged
- 200 miles of roadway damaged

Lessons Learned

Water Experts in Command Room

- Can/should ditches be used for flood relief?
- Who is the contact for ditch?
- Is the dam failing or is it the spillway?

General Public



Prepare for Collateral Damage


- Emergency vs. Long Term Recovery
